

- Title of the paper.
- ◆ Abstract (150–250 words, 4–6 keywords).
- Main text (Introduction, Methods, Results/Findings, Conclusion).
- References: Authors may use any standard style (APA, MLA, Chicago, Harvard, ICMJE, etc.) relevant to their discipline — must be consistent throughout.
- File Format: MS Word (.docx) and PDF.
- Font: Times New Roman.
- Font Size: 12 pt, Line Spacing: 1.5, Justified.

- All submitted articles will undergo a plagiarism check and blind peer screening.
- Direct reproduction or copying from other sources is strictly prohibited.
- Proper references must be provided in the article, either as footnotes or in the reference list.
